Immigration Within the US

Currently, 36 million immigrants are living in America and out of these 36 million, approximately, 12 million are reported to be illegal.

The highest percentage of immigrants come from Mexico and traditionally have settled in major cities in the New York, Florida, New Jersey, and California areas. However, within the past 5 years, there has been an increase of immigrants among areas within the Upper Midwest, Colorado, New England and in the Southeast in part due to the amount of job opportunities in major cities within Texas, Georgia and North Carolina.

Another large group of immigrants within the United States come from China and currently make up about 10.4 million of the population in America.
